

## How to play

- **1.** When it's your turn, spin the spinner.
- **2.** Using a spatula, turn over the number of food items shown on the spinner.
- **3.** If you see any letters that match the starting sound of any of the pictures, you have a match! (Example: "a" and "apple," "b" and "bell," etc.)
- **4.** Collect all the matched grill items and pile them in front of you.
- **5.** Turn any leftover grill items back over, food side up.
- **6.** It's the next player's turn to spin and flip.

## How to set up

1. To assemble your Menu Match spinner, push the spinner base up through the bottom of the square spinner card. Then



- snap the arrow to the base, and you're ready to spin!
- **2.** Pick a level of play. Shuffle and spread out all the grill items, food side up:

Yellow level (beginner)—Just use the pancakes. Red level (intermediate)—Add the French toast. Blue level (advanced)—Add the eggs.

**3.** The youngest player goes first.

# Winning the game

When all the grill items have been collected, the player with the most food wins.

## Levels of play

Yellow Level (beginner)—Just use the pancakes. Red Level (intermediate)—Add the French toast. Blue Level (advanced)—Add the eggs.

Menu Match is a great way for kids to practice learning or differentiating particular letters. For more focused play, use just those letters.

NOTE: All Hooked on Phonics games make great solo exercises to reinforce early reading and spelling skills.
